- Sappi Limited became a signatory to the UN Global Compact in 2008. We have committed to the Science Based Target initiative, and we are focusing on seven UNSDG goals where we can make the greatest impact.

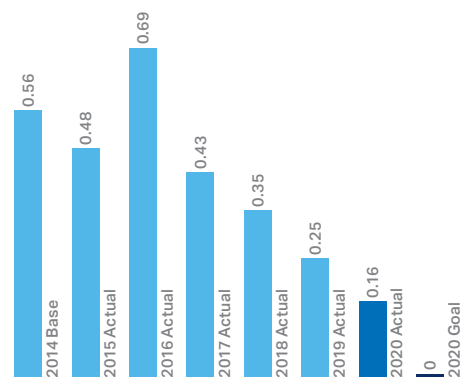


- From 2010 to 2020, we made strategic investments of more than \$650 million in assets to ensure that our customers receive the highest-quality products in the most sustainable manner. We've also invested over \$126 million in R&D. Sappi is committed to delivering solutions that unlock the full potential of trees by exploring biofuels, biochemicals, and other breakthrough products that can replace those made with fossil fuel.

- In 2020, Sappi North America celebrated its 12th consecutive year as an EPA SmartWay® Transport Partner, utilizing transport carriers that leverage technology to minimize our collective carbon footprint.
- SNA received the Leadership in Sustainability – Water Award from the American Forest & Paper Association in 2020 for a project that recycled chemicals and reduced freshwater needs of the Somerset Mill in Skowhegan, Maine.
- In 2020, EcoVadis recognized SNA as a Platinum-rated company, their highest level, putting us in the top 1% of pulp and paper companies assessed.

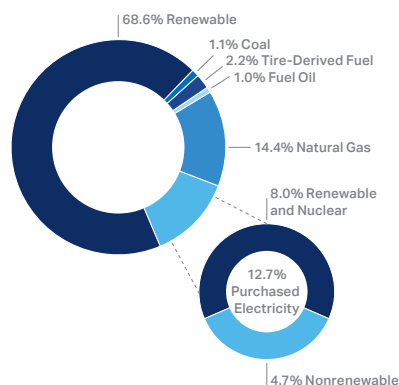
Lost time injury frequency rate

Commitment to our employees

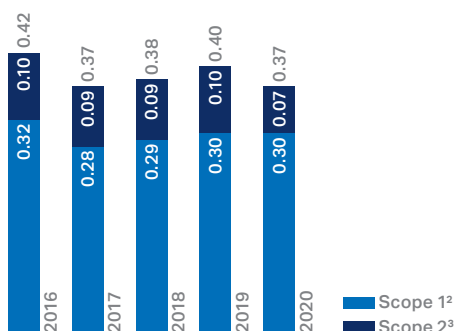
- Sappi is committed to representing the diversity of the communities it serves, including in leadership positions.

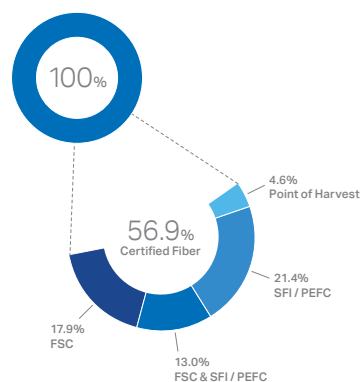
2020 Sappi North America total energy

Decarbonization and partnership for transparency

In 2020, Sappi signed a letter of commitment to join the Science Based Target initiative, which requires companies to set and meet GHG emission reduction targets for 2030 and 2050. This goal is to keep the global temperature increase well below 2°C compared to preindustrial temperatures. We have also expanded our carbon reporting to include scope 3 emissions, seeking input from our suppliers so that we can develop reduction strategies for these emissions. This is a substantial effort that will require full supply chain transparency, and we look forward to the enhanced partnership this will drive.

Keeping forests as forests

We act as champions for sustainable forestry—working to keep forestland forested for generations to come. Taking an active role in management can improve the health and wellbeing of the forest by mitigating conditions that make the forest more susceptible to damage from fire, insects, or disease. We begin by partnering with landowners to creating a healthy plan for growth, harvest, and regeneration so they can reinvest in their forests instead of selling their land for agriculture or business development.

Supporting our partners for good

In 2020, Sappi provided technical and financial support for the development of the Biodiversity Benchmark, co-created by Textile Exchange and The Biodiversity Consultancy. This tool will enable companies to understand their impacts and dependencies on nature, chart a pathway to delivering positive biodiversity outcomes, and benchmark their progress.

Ideas that Matter

Since 1999, Sappi's Ideas that Matter program has granted nearly \$14 million to help fund a wide range of social impact causes ranging from sustainable food systems to healthcare to climate change. The program has been expanded to employees in North America, providing direct funding to nonprofit organizations that Sappi employees are most passionate about.
